

I FOUND A BABY BIRD... NOW WHAT?

IS THE BIRD HURT **OR SICK?**

(unable to flutter wings; bleeding; wings drooping unevenly; weak or shivering; attacked by cat/dog)

Call an LDWF licensed wildlife rehabilitator* (contact info on back) or licensed wildlife veterinarian PRIOR to intervening.

IS IT FEATHERED?

IT'S A NESTLING

CAN YOU FIND THE NEST? IS IT INTACT?

Nestlings need help! (BE AWARE: some birds nest on the ground and may already be in their nest)

IT'S A FLEDGLING

IS THE BIRD SAFE FROM CATS, DOGS, AND PEOPLE?

Normal behavior to be hopping on ground; parents are still feeding it.

PUT BIRD IN NEARBY BUSHES OR ON A TREE LIMB. ARE PARENTS **NEARBY?**

Observe from a distance

LEAVE THE AREA Baby is OK

SUBSTITUTE NEST Poke holes in bottom of **PUT BABY BACK**

Call an LDWF licensed wildlife rehabilitator* (contact info on back) or licensed wildlife veterinarian.

In Louisiana, it is against the law to possess injured/orphaned birds without LDWF & USFWS Migratory Bird Rehabilitation permits, even if you plan to release them. It is also against the law to possess/import/export

wildlife as pets or for the pet trade in Louisiana.
